Baby-sit (free of charge) to give parents a few hours of time together

Teach a child a simple prayer

Visit parish priest or invite him to your home; thank them for what they do

Accompany parish ministers of the Eucharist as they bring Communion to home bound

Join one of the choirs

Hold a fund-raising project to purchase a piece of equipment needed by the parish

Find out what the parish organizations are doing and offer to help

Sponsor a food or clothing drive for the needy

Service Within the Neighboring Community

baby-sit free for needy families visit and help the elderly and shut-ins organize and help with neighborhood clean-up projects

Adopt an elderly person in the community that needs cleaning, yard work, run errands, visit them, write a letter, remember them on special occasions, such as birthdays, trips to the doctor, library, etc.

Prepare a meal or food for the sick

Collect food for food shelves

Organize recess activities for younger children or read stories to them at indoor recess time (Call a teacher and offer to help)

Invite some elderly person to lunch, or to special programs in which you are involved at school
